A. From here to there

Matthew 17:19-20 (NIV) ¹⁹ Then the disciples came to Jesus in private and asked, “Why couldn’t we drive it out?” ²⁰ He replied, “Because you have so little faith Truly I tell you, if you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, ‘Move from here to there,’ and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you.”

Hebrews 11:1 (NKJV) Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.

A. We tend to only believe what we can see, or experience first hand

Hebrews 11:6 (NIV) And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him.

C. What seemed foolish in one season was counted as faith in the next

D. Take the step

- You can tell if your faith has the opportunity to grow if a sacrifice is attached to it

Galatians 5:6 (NLT) For when we place our faith in Christ Jesus, there is no benefit in being circumcised or being uncircumcised. What is important is faith expressing itself in love.
