I. The Call to a Supernatural Perspective

- We live in a time where it is not optional for the believer — we must commit to getting heaven's perspective on all things.
- We must begin to see things as God sees them.
- This perspective is supernatural, not natural.
 - The natural is real, but the supernatural is more real (Hebrews 11:3).
- Often, we are fixated on what was or what is, and fail to see what will be.
- It is easy to:
 - Get stuck in the negative side of life.
 - Think we are seeing things God's way when we are not (delusion).

II. Putting On "God Goggles"

As the Church, we must choose to see through God's perspective.

- Joel 2 Promise:
 - God will pour out His Spirit on all.
 - Sons and daughters will be used for Kingdom purposes.
 - God promises a great move — "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."
- The greatest revival ever to touch planet Earth is upon us.

III. How Do I Get My God Goggles On?

2 Corinthians 3:16 (TPT): But the moment one turns to the Lord with an open heart, the veil is lifted and they see.

- Paul's Conversion:
 - Knocked off his horse by Jesus (Acts 9:17–18, MSG).
 - Scales fell from his eyes after three days.
 - Brought out of darkness into God's marvelous light.
- Paul's earthly life was far from easy:
 - Persecuted, distrusted, threatened with death.
 - Imprisoned multiple times.
 - Severely beaten, stoned, shipwrecked, hungry, thirsty, cold.
- Yet, Paul lived with God Goggles because he had God's work to do in him and through him.



IV. Shifting Perspective

To get God's perspective, some things must be forgotten and let go of.

- Philippians 3:14 (MSG): Keep your eye on the goal — Christ Jesus.
- Having God Goggles means:
 - Knowing His perspective.
 - Believing it.
 - Speaking it.
- Let Him overwhelm the thing that overwhelms you!

V. What God Does Through His Perspective

- He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds.
- He takes what the world calls useless and makes it priceless.
- He takes dirty things and makes them clean.
- He brings life to hopeless situations.
- Isaiah 61:2–3 (TLB):
 - Beauty for ashes.
 - Joy instead of mourning.
 - Praise instead of heaviness.
 - God plants His people like strong oaks for His glory.

VI. The God Perspective in Action

- God uses even the worst situations hell and the world throw at us.
- When we have His perspective, He brings healing and help through us — and He gets the glory.
- Paul's ministry:
 - Healed a lame man.
 - Saw diseases cured.
 - Cast out demons.
 - Raised the dead.
 - Walked out of prison because it was God's plan.
- Romans 8:28: Fear not — God will work all things out.

VII. Closing Charge

- God asked the prophet: "Can these bones live?"
 - God wants us to know, see, and say with faith.
- Steps to take:
 - Understand the need for God and truth.
 - Listen and look for God.
 - Repent.
 - Commit to letting Him align your heart to His way.
 - Let go of the things that weigh you down.
 - Expect God to do mighty things in you.
 - Expect God to do wonderful things through you.
